

UNIFORM

1. Registrations

- All players must purchase their uniform from the Club to ensure consistency of colour and design.
- Players must ensure they have the correct uniform prior to the commencement of the season.
- New and second-hand uniforms are available for purchase by contacting the Uniform Coordinator.
- Payment is by on-line banking only.

2. NET SET GO:

- Net Set Go top provided as part of the membership
- Sports shoes

3. U9, U10 and U11:

- Navy blue skirt / shorts with no pockets.
- Navy/black sports briefs.
- BDNC Playing Top (to be used for playing matches and training sessions)
- Sports shoes and white socks.

4. U12 and above:

- BDNC bodysuit
- BDNC playing top and shorts with no pockets
- Navy/black sports briefs.
- BDNC playing top to be used for training sessions
- Sports shoes and white socks.

5. Club Dress Code

- No jewellery to be worn (medical alert bracelets/chains must be securely taped with strapping tape).
- No gloves may be worn (unless required for a medical condition).
- Nails must be cut short or taped (with strapping tape) in accordance with rules of Association where match is played.
- Hats and sunscreen required when outdoors.
- Hair must be tied back if long.
- Players must bring their own drink bottle.

6. BDNC merchandise

Additional BDNC merchandise is available to be purchased. Items include sports socks, drink bottles, jumpers, jackets and bags. The BDNC philosophy is to apply minimal 'mark up' to the uniforms to ensure the cost and items are accessible to all members of the community.

7. Lost property

Property that has been left at the BDNC clubrooms after a training session will be kept in the Lost Property tub. Any items that have not been collected by the end of each year will be taken to the Op Shop or disposed of.

8. Second hand uniforms

BDNC facilitate the sale of second-hand bodysuits at no cost to the community. Payments are by cash only. Please see the Uniform Coordinator for more information and current stock.
